Public Safety Chaplaincy Training Program

SCLEAP entered into partnership with Lenoir Rhyne University, Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary and The Law Enforcement Chaplaincy for South Carolina in 2016 in order to develop a comprehensive training program for those who wished to serve as Chaplains in the field of Public Safety. Building on the work of ICPC and other similar organizations, this ecumenical program seeks to train not only those serving as volunteer chaplains in Public Safety Agencies, it seeks to provide a starting place for those seeking to enter fulltime chaplaincy service with Fire, EMS, Police and/or Communications.

As of May 2020, two cohorts have completed the 18 month training program. Contact information is provided below if you would like to speak with a recent graduate. Also below you will see a sample of topics covered, a sample bibliography of course texts and a brief bio-sketch of Dr. Tony Everett.

The next block of training we will offer will be a 21-week online Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) Extended Unit focusing on Public Safety Chaplaincy. Normally CPE is taught in a hospital context. This ACPE-certified unit will be completely focused on Public Safety Chaplaincy. It will include 100 classroom hours of training on public safety chaplaincy issues and 300 clinical hours connected to public safety chaplaincy service. The Rev. Dr. Daryl S. Everett
Dewey F. Beam Professor of Pastoral Care



Dr. Everett earned his undergraduate degree from Youngstown University, his M.Div., from Hamma School of Theology (now part of Trinity Lutheran Seminary) and his Th.D., Boston University School of Theology.

Prior to coming to LTSS Dr. Everett was a parish pastor in Ohio. He has also served as the director of a community mental health center in New York.

His current research interests focus on integrating biblical insights and contemporary challenges of leadership in congregational ministry. He often serves the South Carolina Synod as an interim pastor, working especially with congregations that have experienced some degree of discord.

Away from seminary, Dr. Everett enjoys sports, body surfing, and ballroom dancing with his wife, Judy. Dr. Everett retired from LTSS in 2013 and teaches the Pastoral Theology and the Capstone Courses in the Public Safety Chaplaincy Certification Course.
